The whole team had recent <u>training on outdoors experiences for children</u>, provided by Stramash Outdoors Nurseries. Cameron and Phil set up some exciting experiences for children and worked with the children alongside staff. We then had a twilight staff session to discuss our ideas about play and risk and the benefits of outdoors for children. You should expect to see or hear about some excellent challenging experiences for children over the coming months with cooking on the fire, rope ladders, rope walkways and role-play outdoors. As you might know, we have outdoors suits for children so that we can play outside in all weathers. These have just been re-waterproofed. Sometimes not all children have wellies for their feet though. We do have a good number of spares but if possible please <u>make sure your child has a pair that has their name on</u>. They should also have suitable shoes for indoors though as wellies are not only unsuitable for children to wear all day but are also are very messy when they are wet or muddy.









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Thank you to all the parents who have collected their **sponsored outdoors hunt sheet** for out Autumn fundraiser. If you didn't get one yet, please ask! Happy hunting. We hope that parents can return their sponsor forms and money over the next week or so.

I wanted to take this chance to remind parents about the <u>importance of sticking to the collection</u> <u>times</u>. The morning session finishes at 12.45pm and the afternoon at 5.45pm which are the latest times to collect. However some families have different arrangements (e.g. collection at 4pm or at 3pm, or drop off at 9.30am). Please keep to these agreed times as this is when the staff but also the children are expecting to be collected. If you are at all unsure just ask.

We will soon be receiving delivery of lots of very young <u>trees from the Woodland Trust</u>. We will be planting in nursery, and in the local community. If any parents have gardens or friends or family members with gardens who would like a tree to plant, please email me and let me know as we will be able to arrange this. We have various native varieties coming. Tree planting, as well as other planting throughout the year, is an important part of children's learning and developing care for their environment.

We recently celebrated <u>Meskel</u>, an <u>Ethiopean festival</u>, celebrated by at least one of our families. We had a good fire, and ate some bread baked and provided by a parent – thank you! I am so happy to be celebrating all the days that are important to our families, so if there are any celebrations that are important to your family, please don't hesitate to tell us!
