
Children's session times need to be adhered to due to staffing and the possibility that you may incur charges!

The Sunflower Room have been developing their independence skills as they are encouraged and supported at lunch time to use their own knife and fork.

The children have been developing their gross motor skills, balance and Risky Play through developing their skills on the bikes, throwing and kicking balls and climbing palletes.

The children have been becoming more familiar with the Golden Rules and beginning to develop their understanding of the language used in the play room.

The children have demonstrated a great interest in transport both indoors and outdoors. The children have been exploring movement and sounds, whilst also discovering pattern and colours.

The book of the Plan was 'The Three Little Pigs' where the children explored and discovered number and counting in sequence. Patterns and prints using playdough and paint.

The Rising 3's engaged well in the Farm Shop where the children discovered technologies using the till, as an adult lead experience the children used real money in their role play and included real potatoes, onions and carrots to sell in the shop. This lead onto tasting experiences and the children learning about preparing and cutting foods safely.

This has progressed onto the children demonstrating an interest learning more about the farm and farm animals which will continue over Spring!








The children in the Rainbow have been developing their independence skills and are being encouraged to put on and take of their own shoes/wellies, jackets and jumpers! Please encourage these independence skills at home!!

The children are actively participating in the Childsmile tooth brushing programme where they are learning about the importance of healthy teeth and healthy foods, This experience is also a learning opportunity for children to develop their Numeracy and matching skills alongside recognising their name. Book of plan was 'Goldilocks and the 3 Bears' where the children could recite their favourite part of the story and learned about size using the language small, medium and large.

The children have been learning about healthy and unhealthy foods and their impact on the human body. Learning about various shapes, colours and textures and exploring their senses and new smells and tastes.

Here at Langa Street Nursery the children have been participating in programmes such as PATHS to learn about feelings and emotions. Through discussions with our children at our Golden Rules the children are encouraged to keep everyone safe including themselves, developing an understanding of the UNCRC Children's Rights and implementing them using kind hands, kind feet and kind words. The children are encouraged to 'Choose Play Put-Away' which allows the children to develop an understanding of why we look after our learning environment and resources, to keep everyone safe and also about being mindful of their peers and taking responsibility for their choices.













The Sunshine Room

All children access Sensory experiences to support and encourage children to develop their fine motor skills and explore large physical play including the ball pool, jumping on the trampoline and using the slide.

The children have been using the light box and other electronic resources to explore various sounds, colours and lights. The parachute is a great experience to support and encourage relationships, literacy skills through singing and playing games.
